All of us involved with Crieff Community Trust hope that you and your family are staying safe and well in these unprecedented times. We'd like to update you on some Trust matters, as we have continued to work on a number of projects during lockdown.

Crieff Community Trust virtual AGM - Thursday 20 August 19.00

Our board has continued to meet virtually during lockdown and we have agreed to hold an online AGM this year. This is in line with guidance from the Scottish Charity Regulator (OSCR) about business continuity during the Covid -19 pandemic, which advises that, in these exceptional circumstances, charities may hold their AGM online, even if this is not provided for in their constitution. There will be the opportunity to hear the latest news of our projects and to ask questions.

The virtual AGM will be held at 19.00 on Thursday 20 August. We will email nearer the time with details of the agenda and how to log in to the online meeting.

Help to remove Himalayan Balsam and keep fit at Turretbank Wood

Since taking over responsibility for Turretbank Wood, CCT has organised three campaigns to eradicate the presence of the invasive species Himalayan Balsam.

This year CCT will not be organising any specific group sessions to remove the balsam, in view of the current social distancing requirements to help keep our community safe. That said, some individuals have already advised that at the end of June and in the first half of July they intend to visit Turretbank Wood to carry out their own campaigns. In the past whilst CCT and their supporters have been working pulling up Himalayan Balsam it was normal for each of us to work on our own "patch" and this was usually at least some 10 or more metres away from the next person working their "patch". Accordingly, if you wish to continue the eradication of Himalayan Balsam at Turretbank Wood, this could be carried out as part of your own alternative Joe Wicks workout in isolation - albeit there may be other individuals some 10 or more metres away from you doing the same for the community woodland.
